



## ASK NUMBER ONE

Lt. (j.g.) Rex Rouviere wants to know about the Klingon rite of ascension and the Klingon system of law.

To begin with, Klingons are very private about their rites and rituals. It is unusual for an outsider to witness or know anything about Klingon rites. As a warrior race, Klingons are most concerned about courage, strength, and honor. Therefore, their rituals reflect these concerns.

The earliest Klingon rite takes place shortly after the birth of a male baby. It is known as the "First Blood" ritual. With a ceremonial knife, an incision is made in the upper arm of the infant, allowing the "first blood" to flow. The father of the child then cuts himself and lets his blood mingle with that of his son. It is believed that the courage and strength of the father will transfer to his son as he grows to manhood. This ritual is not performed for the female infant. Instead, she is coddled and spoiled. It is up to her future mate to tame and mollify her.

The next major ritual comes at the "age of inclusion." When a Klingon male reaches the age of twelve, he is ready to be initiated into manhood. This is known as the "rite of inclusion." The young candidate is given over to a line of a dozen warriors, through which he must pass. Each warrior will wound him with a ceremonial sword, drawing blood. He must endure his ordeal without crying out or showing pain. After playing their part in the ritual, the warriors withdraw, leaving the young man to bear his wounds in silence. The next morning his family goes to greet him. If he is still alive, his cuts are bound and the day is given over to feasting and celebrating his manhood.

Six years later, the young man reaches the "age of ascension." At this time, and every six years thereafter, the man goes through the "rite of ascension." He must pass through a tunnel of warriors who strike him with painsticks. He gives the ritualistic responses to their queries enduring the pain to show his courage and strength. It is a matter of pride that a man complete each step in his rites of ascension. He looks upon it as a cowardly act if he misses one of the rites. It is also important that he has his family and friends present for the ritual, that he may show his bravery to loved ones.

Other rituals, such as the Ru'stai, or bonding ritual, and the Klingon death ritual, have been seen briefly on the episodes, but not much is known about their rituals. They are similar to various other races in their desire to shroud their rites in secrecy. They feel it is a sign of weakness to allow strangers or outsiders to know of their traditions.

As far as their legal system goes, Klingons tend to make up the rules as they go. As is seen in Star Trek VI: The Undiscovered Country, honor and vengeance count for more than justice. A strict code of honor determines Klingon responses to situations, such as Worf's challenge and execution of Duras in the episode "Reunion."

I hope this answers your question about Klingon las and rituals. If you would like to know more about Klingons and their traditions, read the novel "The Final Reflection" by John M. Ford, "The Starfleet Intelligence Manual" concerning Klingons, and the FASA gaming module entitled "Klingons." You may also want to review the episodes which prominently featured Klingons. For those who are especially interested, you could join a Klingon fan group, such as "The Klingon Assault Group" or "The Klingon Strike Force."




The following personnel have distinguished themselves and have complied with the rules and regulations and are hereby promoted in rank:





Turning Concern Into Action

A couple of years ago the mayor sent out a flyer that stated how every day people in the Salt Lake Valley dump 2,100 tons of garbage. Much of this is a needless waste of our precious land and raw materials. Recycling benefits you and Utah. You can make a difference and help conquer this growing problem.

BE KIND TO OUR EARTH--WE AREN'T OUT IN SPACE YET AND WE STILL HAVE TO LIVE WITH WHAT GARBAGE WE MAKE. WE STILL HAVE TO BREATH THE POLLUTED AIR THAT WE MAKE. WE STILL HAVE TO LIVE WITH THE FACT THAT THIS IS THE ONLY PLACE WHERE WE CAN LIVE. IF WE CONTINUE TO CONTAMINATE IT WE WILL ONE DAY SUFFOCATE IN OUR OWN WASTE!!!!!!!!!!!!!

The ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY found that regular household recycling requires less than two minutes a day. So let's get started or re-

This labor-saving process is called PRECYCLING. By shopping for reduced packaging and creatively reusing what we already have, we could shrink the volume of trash going into our landfills by as much as 10-15%. PRECYCLING TIPS:

\*Tote groceries in a reusable canvas or cotton mesh bag

\*Favor products with minimum packaging

\*Buy in bulk

\*Buy concentrates and refillable containers

\*Shred, wad, or crumple your junk mail or non-recyclable paper and use it for package cushioning

\*Photocopy on both sides of the paper (Any good secretary can show you how)

\*Use plastic produce bags to line small trash cans or wrap sandwiches

\*Search out permanent replacements for disposable products such as pens, razor blades, and batteries, as well as diapers

Newspapers, magazines, colored/white paper, computer paper, cardboard, aluminum, steel, iron, glass, all forms of plastic including styrofoam, copper, brass, etc.

Kathy's Market, New Frontiers Market, and Sugarhouse Recycling Center only take newspaper, aluminum, and cardboard.

Metro Steel recyclers only take metal stuff and only pay for aluminum

(as do other places around the valley).

If you want to know who is taking stuff not listed here, it is best to find our who takes that particular item by calling Joyce Meech at the landfill. The number is 974-6920. She can tell you who is taking things like oil, car batteries, cars, and other things not listed.

There are other places around but I only listed a few. If any of you

know of good places around, let us know.

REMEMBER THESE RULES ABOUT RECYCLING YOUR STUFF:

All steel cans must be clean and have labels and ends removed Glass should be clean and have metal lids removed. Labels are okay. Cardboard should be corrugated, unwaxed Steel dealers will accept large appliances (remove capacitors) Higher prices may be given if metals are separate and clean Plastic items accepted include milk containers, water containers, 2-liter soft drink bottles and liquid soap containers. Items should be clean with no lids.


#### KELLY TUBING PARTY

There are many popular beliefs around the world about how April Fools Day came to be.





Jonathan Frakes went through six weeks of auditions for the role of Commander William Riker, but as he says, "I knew this was a real part...a big one and I had to get it."

He credits executive producer Gene Roddenberry with giving him just the right insight into Riker that eventually won him the role. "Gene is so very non-Hollywood and really quite paternal. One of the things he said to me was, 'You have a Machiavellian glint in your eye. Life is a bowl of cherries.' I think Gene feels that way, which is why he writes the way he does. He's very positive and Commander Riker will reflect that," Frakes says.

As the Enterprise's executive officer and second-in-command, the actor sees his character as "strong, centered, honorable and somewhat driven. His job is to provide Captain Picard (Patrick Stewart) with the most efficiently run ship and the best prepared crew he can. Because of that he seems to maintain a more military bearing than the other characters in behavior and physicality, despite the fact salutes and other military protocol no longer exist in the 24th Century," Frakes explains.

Although "Star Trek" represents what Frakes terms a "real step up in my career," the actor has had recurring roles in "Falcon Crest," "Paper Dolls" and "Bare Essence," and for a year was a contract player on the daytime drama "The Doctors."

His other television work includes a variety of episodic guest-starring roles, the television movie "The Nutcracker" and critically-praised roles in the miniseries "Dream West" and "North & South" (Parts I and II). Frakes has also appeared on and off Broadway and in several regional theatre productions.

Born and raised in Pennsylvania, Frakes did his undergraduate work at Penn State. He then went to Harvard, spending several seasons with the Loeb Drama Center, and then moved to New York. "I gave myself a five-year limit. If I wasn't making a living at acting in five years, I would find something else to do.

"After a year-and-a-half of being the worst waiter in New York and screwing up my back as a furniture mover, I got a role in 'Shenandoah' on Broadway and then landed a part in 'The Doctors,'" he says.

Frakes spent five years in New York and in 1979, at the suggestion of his agent, moved to Los Angeles where he began getting work in episodic television almost immediately. "I really have been very lucky. There's a cliché in this business that says the easy part of being an actor is doing the job. The hardest part is getting the job. And I think that's true."

Frakes is married to actress Genie Francis ("Days of Our Lives") and resides in Los Angeles.

#### Star Trek: Deep Space Nine

On January 20, 1992, Paramount unveiled plans to launch an all-new, first-run, hour-long dramatic TV series for syndication called Star Trek: Deep Space Nine, the newest series incarnation of the highly successful Star Trek franchise. According to a press release from Paramount, the announcement of the spin-off series from The Next Generation was made by Kerry McCluggage, president of the Paramount Television Group, at a press conference in New Orleans in conjunction with the National Association of Television Program Executives Conference. Production is slated to begin in June 1992 on an initial 20 episodes of Star Trek: Deep Space Nine for the first season. The series, along with an all-new Untouchables TV series, will be distributed by Paramount Domestic Television and produced by Paramount Network Television, and each is scheduled to debut in January 1993 with a two-hour premiere movie. Twenty-six episodes of both series are planned for each subsequent season, beginning with Fall 1993, and filming will take place at Paramount's soundstages in Hollywood. Each hour-long episode of the first season of Deep Space Nine (the show's working title) is budgeted at a whopping \$1.5 million, which exceeds Next Generation's budget. Paramount, in an effort to differentiate its new Star Trek series from other hour weekly offerings, is stressing lavish production values for the upcoming show. Said Paramount spokesperson McCluggage, "Star Trek redefined the science fiction genre and is arguably the most visionary space drama ever conceived. These properties are two of Paramount's crown jewels, and the new series will be true to the quality of their predecessors while living up to the expectations of today's audiences." In the press release, Paramount said that two TV stations had already committed to carry one or both of the TV series, while ongoing discussions with stations across the USA have met with an "overwhelmingly positive and extremely enthusiastic" response. Paramount said that they expected an extremely high percentage of the USA's TV stations to be onboard in time for the series debut. Star Trek: Deep Space Nine was created and will be executive produced by Next Generation executive producers Rick Berman and Michael Piller. Set in the 24th Century, the same time as The Next Generation, the new series Star Trek: Deep Space Nine follows the adventures of a new team of Starfleet officers who take command of a remote alien space station situated near a newly discovered wormhole--a shortcut through space that has become one of the most strategic locations in the galaxy.

"If, as Gene Roddenberry often said, 'Star Trek is Wagon Train in space,' then Deep Space Nine can be compared to a wild west town on the edge of the frontier with all the excitement and adventure that kind of locale can generate," said Piller. Added Berman, "Setting Star Trek: Deep Space Nine during the same time as Star Trek: The Next Generation will allow an exchange of characters and occasional story lines between each show." According to Paramount sources quoted to the star of the same time as Star Trek: The Next Generation will allow an exchange of characters and occasional story lines between each show." According to Paramount sources quoted in Broadcasting (January 27, 1992), Deep Space Nine will feature considerably more action than in The Next Generation, and will more closely resemble Star Wars than Star Trek. "It'll be more fun with more action. We'll have more freedom because they won't be confined to the ship." Paramount's decision to premiere the new show in January was based on higher TV viewing levels during the winter, the absence of the chaos associated with the fall launches of new network series, and the fact that local TV stations have more advertising inventory in January. Local TV stations buying the first-run show (first being offered by Paramount to stations currently airing Next Generation) must also commit to the backstripping" of the shows, which means later airing the reruns Monday through Friday. The backend schedule for stations will allow them six runs over three years. On January 21, 1992, USA Today quoted Berman saying, "This show will have more of an edge to it." Unlike The Next Generation and the original series, Deep Space Nine won't take place on a starship streaking through space. The wormhole in the new show "will bring in all kinds of interest from alien life forms," said Piller. USA Today reported that the characters from Next Generation may be included in the new show. The lead character will be a man of action—a single parent raising a 12-year-old son. Another character "in his natural form looks like a large bowl of Jell-O," Berman added, and will take on humanoid forms. (Hmmm, sounds like Maya on Space 1999.) The Jell-O creature, Piller says, "like Spock and Data will give us a chance to reflect and comment on humanity." Although now only under discussion, it's possible that Chief O'Brien and family, as well as Ensign Ro, may become regulars on the new spin-off. Rumors had been floating around for months regarding a proposed all-new Star Trek TV series. USA Today reported (apparently erroneously, comparing it to the Paramount press release) on January 8, 1992, that fans should get ready for Star Trek: Two Generations Removed. Perhaps Paramount changed their mind because the title was so bad? USA Today reported that the proposed spin-off was being shopped around to local TV stations for syndication. At that time, no one at Paramount would comment on the hot rumor, but Electronic Media reported earlier (again, apparently erroneously) that the new of the not into, our recursive means reported earter (again, apparently erroneously) that the new series would be a "prequel." It's unclear if the late Gene Roddenberry had any hand in the development of Deep Space Nine, but it doesn't appear as if he did since neither the Paramount press release we received, nor USA Today, made any mention of it. In related news from the TV executives convention, Genesis Entertainment announced a half-hour, late-night talk show to be helmed by Whoopi ("Guinan" Goldberg, set for syndication this fall. The news of Goldberg's talk-show reportedly met with favorable reaction, but couched with concern whether she will be able to make the transition to television, particularly as she has set a hectic production schedule. Also disclosed at the convention was a new hour-long weekly sci-fi drama called *Time Trax*. It's a time travel show to be produced by Harve Bennett, veteran producer of Star Trek II, III, IV, and V. But back to the Next Generation spin-off series, Trek fans can give credit (or blame, depending upon your initial feelings on the forthcoming show) to Brandon Tartikoff, who became chairman of Paramount Pictures last year. In an interview with USA Today on August 22, 1991, Tartikoff, the former head NBC programmer, said that syndicated shows like The Next Generation, Entertainment Tonight, and The Arsenio Hall Show contribute "so much" to Paramount's bottom line. Because of that, Tartikoff began talks with producers of Next Generation, E.T., and Hall last year about producing offshoot shows. # Scientists Find Sound Plan for Brain Cells

IRVINE, Calif. — In a discovery that could one day help blind people see and have a major impact on w dozens of brain disorders and diseases, scientists say a they have found a way to selectively put some brain veills to sleep while leaving other cells unharmed.

Research scientists at the University of California, Irvine, say specially focused and intensified ultrasound waves — like those used to create images of structures in the body — can temporarily half brain-

The ultrasound waves pass through tissues without causing any harm and target specific neurons, shutting them down while the high-frequency waves cell activity.

"The applications of this are very exciting and important," said Dr. Joie Jones, a professor of radiology and principal researcher on the technique, which was published in Brain Research, a technical journal.

can also cause the neurons to fire," Jones said.

"Imagine. You could hook a person who was born without an optic nerve, hook them up to a transducer and apply this to the visual cortex. You could map what they see and make a device that would enable that blind person to see."

Like Li. Cmdr. Geordi LaForge, the character in "Star Trek: The Next Generation" who wears the mask over his eyes?

"Yes. Even without the optic nerve, if you can stimulate or suppress the visual cortex in a systematic way, you could make the person see," Jones said.

The method could help depressed people by precisely stimulating or suppressing cells that contribute to the illness, he said. One application would be to hush the haunting voices and hallucinations of schizophrenia.

The technique might be useful in the treatment of intractable pain, said Dr. Ronald Young, chief of
