IT'S OVER . . . AGAIN

Great, it's opening weekend for the biggest movie of the year, and I have to go play Army. Swell. Most of the Kelly is going to our sponsored theater on Friday or Saturday night, and I'm stuck on Ft. Douglas with a bunch of nerds dressed in green (Hey, I'm one of those nerds!). After talking to some friends of mine, we decide to go to the late show on Saturday night, since it's the only way I'll be seeing the movie that weekend.

After a hectic day and missed connections, I'm off to the Flick theater at 9:10 pm hoping to make it to the 9:30 show. I get there just after 9:30, in time to see my friend (who'd bought the tickets that morning at 11:30) waving her arms in exasperation. She'd almost given up on me. We go in to the over crowded theater, and can't find where our seats are being saved by her boyfriend. Finally-there he is-and we take our seats just as the lights dim.

I watched intently as a bottle floated across the screen. I make a comment about how it's probably Dom Perignon. The three of us chuckle and drop it. Then, the label - it IS a bottle of Dom Perignon! The three of us are laughing hysterically, with the rest of the crowd puzzled at our secret fancy.

The movie went on to give us fantastic acting, incredible story development, and out-of-this-world FX. I found myself glued to my seat, drink in hand, watching a miracle in my time: the two most famous Captains meet and work together to save the universe. But...

I found that, once again, it's Kirk saving the star system in question, not Picard. The "passing of the torch" was little more than a glorified 2-hour episode on the big screen. Bigger budget, better guest stars, and way better FX. I honestly expected the final scene to be a blank screen with GOOD BYE printed across it.

Not that I didn't like the movie. I did. I've seen it several times now, and each time it is more enjoyable. The crash scene is one of the most spectacular things I have seen with science fiction (or anything else, for that matter) in my day. The realistic way Cmdr. Data deals with his onslaught of emotion was the comic relief of the weekend. The evacuation was superbly executed, and the filming of it made me want to participate. The way the crew interacts with each other and at each dreadful situation was beautifully designed.

But there were still some things I didn't agree with. First of all, if Scotty knew Kirk was dead, and how he died, why did he claim that the Captain was alive in "Relics"? Second, in "Firstborn" the knife left at the scene of the attack had three inscriptions on it: Lursa, B'Tor, and Lursa's son. If Lursa and B'Tor died in Generations, how could she have borne a son and raised that son with the dignity of the Duras family? Okay, Geordi has saved the USS Enterprise three or four times a season from a core breach, why couldn't he save it this time? Yeah, yeah, a coolant leak, and something wrong with a do-hickey thing-a-ma-bobber, but he could have done something. And even if time has no meaning in the Nexus, memories would still be valid. Why, if Kirk was in the Nexus for 78 years prior to Picard, it was as if he'd just arrived?

These questions may go unanswered for a very long time, but I plan on asking the writers when they come to Utah for the next writers workshop in January.

Let me reiterate: I liked the show very much. It was an incredible work of talent and art. But it was just that: a show. I hope that when the crew of the Enterprise E comes along, they won't feel the need to stand in the shadow of any other crew, cast, or expectations. It's time for them to stand on their own. Like they have been doing for five years now.





Glossary of terms

Show description;

In the two hour premiere, the adventure begins when the starship USS VOYAGER is dispatched in search of a Maquis ship which has disappeared in an unusual region of space known as the "Badlands." The starship finds the Maquis ship but not before being swept up in a strange and terrifying phenomenon which sends them into the far reaches of the galaxy -- so far away that, even at warp speeds, it would take nearly seventy years to return. The two diverse crews band together to explore this distant part of space and to find a way home.

Starship U.S.S. Voyager;

An Intrepid-class vessel capable of holding 200 crew members, the is one of the fastest and most powerful starship in starfleet. Although it is smaller in size than the Enterprise, the Voyager is more technologically advanced than previous vessels, and can operate independently for approximately three years without refueling. Superbly equipped for exploration and research, the Voyager has an equally impressive array of both defensive and offensive weapons, making it ready for action.
