# ASK NUMBER ONE

"Where did the opening phrase of Star Trek come from?"

Space...the final frontier. These are the voyages of the StarShip Enterprise, it's five year mission ...to explore strange new worlds...to seek out new life and new civilizations...to boldly go where no man has gone before.

These words will go down in history as the most well known phrase throughout the world and perhaps the Universe. Gene Roddenberry, the GREAT BIRD OF THE GALAXY, wrote these words to introduce a new television show to the ever expanding television audience. We know these words well, they represent a unique way of life we all have chosen to try and emulate. A vision of a man that has gone, but is not forgotten. I'd like to believe Gene is up there now, helping us through the future he, himself tried to create. But so many of us don't realize that this phrase didn't always ring so true!!

In early August of 1966 (the year I was born...fabulous!!) William Shatner recorded an opening phrase that went like this...

"This is the story of the United Space Ship Enterprise. Assigned a five year patrol of our galaxy, the giant starship visits Earth colonies, regulates commerce, and explores strange new worlds and civilizations. These are it's voyages...and it's adventures."

Gene had many people helping him create the well known series. Many contributed to what is now the legendary Classic Star Trek. Bob Justman was one of those people. On August 2, 1966, Bob sent Gene a memo with his version of the opening phrase...

"This is the story of the Starship Enterprise. It's mission: to advance knowledge, contact alien life and enforce intergalactic law...to explore the strange new worlds where no man has gone before."

Gene looked Bob's idea over and made a few adjustments of his own on the bottom of the memo...

"Where no man has gone before. Space, this is the USS Enterprise Continuing...new planets, exotic life forms, strange alien civilizations. This is the story of the USS STARSHIP ENTERPRISE...these are voyages...it's adventures."

The very same day, John D.F. Black, a writer on the show, also sent a memo to Gene, with his version of the opening phrase...which read...

"Space...the final frontier...endless...silent...waiting. This is the story of the United Space Ship Enterprise...it's mission...a five year patrol of the galaxy...to seek out and contact all alien life... to explore...to travel the vast galaxy where no man has gone before...A Star Trek."


John also submitted a shorter version in case of time constraints at the beginning of the teaser...
"The USS Enterprise...StarShip...it's mission...a five year patrol to seek out and contact alien life...to explore the infinite frontier of space...where no man has gone before...A Star Trek."

Finally, on August 10, 1966 Gene wrote the phrase we have all grown accustomed to hearing at the beginning of every episode of our favorite show. This was the final draft that would "live in infamy".

Gene Roddenberry had a vision of the future I hope that someday this world will achieve. When Gene was born the doctor exclaimed "Why it's a veiled baby!". A "veil" was no more than a part of the placenta that covered the baby's head and shoulder's, but tradition dictated that such a veil meant the child was gifted with second sight-the ability to see the future...I say the doctor was right.




to search the Net for that information, and bring it to the rest of the Kelly. In the future, we'll be answering letters from people on the Internet.

#### TACTICAL/CONN

Lt. Cmdr. T.D. Boone, Chief of Tactical/Conn On Star Trek: the Next Generation, Tactical is in charge of firing the weapons, and analyzing the status of the ships, be it their own, others from the Federation, or enemy; While Conn, being an integral part of Tactical, steers the ship. However, on the Kelly, being a Star Trek club in the real world, this is a bit hard, seeing as there are no space ships, yet. So, what we are in charge of on the Kelly is games, such as Role playing games, Tactical simulators, card games, strategy games, board games etc. Pretty much all games. But, more importantly, we are in charge of competitions, wether they be ship to ship, or between members of our ship going against each other. Sometimes it is our job to plan the competitions, other times, it is our job to train the people of our ship for upcoming competitions against other ships.

Above all, however, I also see it our job to make sure that everyone involved has a fun time. For example, I would try to help someone getting ready for a trivia competition by telling them to relax, and not get all bent out of shape about it, or by saying the same thing to someone who has lost. The Chief Medical officer of the USS KELLY is a female played by Pat Conrady. As such, she is medically responsible for the physical and emotional health of the crew of the Kelly. She also has broad medical science responsibilities in areas of crew moral.

As Senior Ship's Surgeon, Conrady is one woman who can approach Captain Henline on the most intimate personal levels relating to the Captain's physical, mental and emotional well being. Indeed, she has absolute duty to constantly keep abreast of the Captain's condition and speak out openly to him on this matter. She is probably the only person aboard (Sorry Nada) who could talk back to the Captain and get away with it. Part of this stems from the relationship between herself and her Captain and part from her own crusty personality.

Conrady is something of a "Q", a very outspoken character, thats more then a little cynical on her attitudes and observations on life. She has an acid wit which, under close scrutiny, carries more then a grain of truth about medicine, man and society. Like most cynics, CMO Conrady is at heart a bleeding humanist, but she attempts to hide her humanitarian feelings with the brusqueness of her personality.

Of all aboard the KELLY, Conrady is the least military. She is filled with idiosyncrasies, which have become her trademark and is regarded by the other crewmembers as something of an eccentric. Conrady has been put down by the Captain on occasion for speaking out in her straight forward manner.

Usually the CMO can get away with it because of her privileged medical status. StarFleet regulations give her broad areas of responsibility, including the right to demand medical examinations of her Captain's physical and emotional fitness. In many medical areas she can overrule the Captain's orders. In EXTREME emergencies she can and will certify the Captain as unfit for duty.

Conrady has an inbred distrust of machines, as evidenced by her loathing for the computer system used in transmitting information between personnel. She is a highly unlikely space traveller, well into her forties. Conrady considers herself the only realist aboard, measuring each new activity in terms of the annoyances it will personally create for her!!



(or how do you do that every time?)


