

I don't want to make excuses for him, but I do feel he is a talented and gifted man, and I do feel that his success was very hard won.

Leonard Nimoy, doesn't like his fans. He doesn't sign autographs —even for his clubs. (Audrey, the president of his fan club, told me that even she cannot get letters to him, she has to go through his PR guy. She further stated that the PR guy will forge Nimoy's name when letters come asking for autographs). Nimoy doesn't read his fan mail, he doesn't what us to speak to him or come near him. Portraying Mr. Spock is a tedious thing he did once. Nimoy won't do it again unless there is enough money, or attention given to him. He refused the cameo part given him in the last film, and spoke openly that the part was too small, with not enough pay.

The more information I got on him, the lower my heart sank. I don't ever want to follow the kind of person who sees me as an inconvenience, or a bore. I want to be part of a club where the celeb is honored or at least flattered to be singled out.

So the lesson this officer has to pass on at this time is: don't confuse passion for a fictional thing with reality. I love the character which is Spock. Spock is never quite at home on Vulcan or Earth, and we have all felt the pain of being different. Spock is willing to do the right thing, no matter what the cost. Spock is a Hero, but he demands no laurels. Spock is gentle, strong, and intelligent. Spock is a dedicated scientist with a childlike curiosity for anything he sees, and experiences. In Spock we can all remember the inner struggle of trying to gain control of our emotions, but never being quite positive that control was actually achieved. Spock is a fascinating part of my life, and he is not Leonard Nimoy. Leonard Nimoy is a businessman and an artist who has forgotten what it is to be Spock.

Most people play many roles in their lives. Roles like parent, child, breadwinner, homemaker, brother, sister, friend and lover. But most function under one collective role-- individual identity.

Not so in my case. I am identified in at least two specific roles. Leonard Nimoy--actor, and Mr. Spock--Vulcan." (Introduction.)


"For a long time I have been aware that many people would rather meet and talk to Mr. Spock than to Leonard Nimoy. For example at college lecture appearances, students who come to hear and see Leonard Nimoy arrive with mixed hopes and expectations. There is curiosity about Nimoy. What does he look like in the flesh? To what extent is he like Spock? In appearance, in manner, and in thought. Will they be able to experience the Spock presence, or is this to be a human-to-human contact? They will accept Nimoy respectfully and attentively. They are curious to hear what he has to say about himself, his thoughts and interests, etc. There is probably an ongoing comparison between Nimoy and Spock. A search for those human elements which Nimoy must have replaced with Vulcan characteristics.

Occasionally, Nimoy steps momentarily into the Spock character by choice or by accident. The response is a wave of joyous recognition. It is as if Nimoy had stripped away the human facade and given the audience a glimpse of the real person, the Vulcan in the flesh disguised as a (Page 66.)

"Spock is a good man to have around. He is brilliant, dignified, loyal, and cool. In a crisis where humans stumble, Spock functions with logical efficiency. He is extremely honest and incorruptible. He seems to be compassionate, although he would deny it because that borders on emotionalism." (Page 100.)

"Spock is a safe and comforting, even desirable resolution of the extraterrestrial question. Many people have gone to great lengths in writing to me about the effect he has had on their lives. They often tell movingly that he demonstrated a dignified way for the individual to function in what, for many, is a hostile society. If there are extratrerrestials and if we are to encounter them or be visited by them, most people would be relieved if they were all like Spock.

It is easy to forget that Spock was created by humans. And if he does in fact represent elevated concepts of life, its value and its meaning, then those elevated concepts must be credited to the human race. Personally I find this an enormously exciting challenge-- to try to live up to the broader vision and deeper perception that I helped build into this fictional character." (Page 101.)

- New Title!!! Star Trek: First Contact. After abandoning Resurrection to Aliens 4, the 8th Trek film needed a new title. Director Jonathan Frakes put his directorial foot down on even nicknaming the movie Generations II, so for awhile the untitled film was called by a number of suggested titles, including Star Trek: Destinies. The 2nd unit filming began in Arizona in March. The movie will have a Thanksgiving release.



Avery Brooks (Capt Sisko) got an honorary Doctoral of Fine Arts from Oberlin College.



"If \bar{I} acquire some marbles, then \bar{I} may join you?" "Hell, yeah."


AN ACCESSORY BEFORE THE FACT



marbles if you fix my compu-teach so I pass the next four history tests. Okay?"


Spock weighed the consequences of his actions. The chances of anyone noticing that the programming had been altered were slight. "I agree."

The tone of her voice struck fear into the heart of one very small and very desperate Vulcan. "N-nothing."



"Yes, sir."


Spock was led up the stairs to meet his destiny--a bar of soap.



This fund is the chosen charity of The Leonard Nimoy Club. This fund makes contributions to the Cystic Fibrosis patients on "10 EAST" of The Children's Hospital of Boston. Cystic Fibrosis patients are often required to make long stays in the hospital, most of them are children. The A.N.M.F. helps to pay for special activities for these children: phone calls to their parents or friends, supplies for crafts, pizza and chinese dinners, special parties, and any individual needs that may come up. At present most children born with Cystic Fibrosis do not survive into adulthood.

Some time before his death, Alan Nimoy wrote a courageous resolution:
"I will fight this disease when there is fighting to be done.

live when there is nothing to live for. But most of all I
will live a life just like any healthy person no matter what
anybody says."
