Dear Doctor Xoc:

Your inquiries find me quite well and in good humor. You will find attached copies of all recent medical scans and notes from Doctor Akiela Xal, CMO of the USS Kelly regarding my current medical status.

As to your inquiry of exactly how I managed to get stabbed by a Klingon Lieutenant, I will try to explain the events that lead up to Lt. Kurg's attack.



Even a single automatic torpedo pod can throw a respectable weight of ordnance. Coeur De Lion's twin pods can have four torpedos on the way to a target simultaneously, with another volley seconds behind it. With each torpedo tracked to a seperate individual target, or the full weight of shot falling on the same target, the system has been decisive in numerous actions.

INSECTOID XINDI INVASION! By Lt. Pam Carson

The dreaded Insectoids have invaded earth and are expected to attack in Utah beginning this month! The disease these mosquito-like Xindi carry is called West Nile Virus. The insectoids will attack from now until the first frost in October and Star Fleet members are asked to be aware of these creatures and their virus.

West Nile Virus was discovered in 1937 in Africa but didn't make it to the United States until 1999. West Nile Virus is caused by a bite from an infected mosquito that is carrying the virus. Not everyone who gets bitten will get the virus. The mosquito gets the virus from infected birds.

Symptoms depend on the person who becomes infected. 80% of people who are infected will not show any symptoms at all. Kids with normal immune systems usually get flu-like illnesses. People over 50 years old and those with weakened immune systems are most at risk of infection. Most of the time the symptoms are similar to the flu: fever, headache, confusion, neck and back stiffness, muscle ache, tiredness, joint pain, swollen glands and a rash.

The United Federation of Planets and the Center for Disease Control are working hard to prevent the spread of the virus by killing the eggs of the mosquitoes.

Here are some ways to protect yourself from this virus:

- Avoid being outside during the early morning or early evening when mosquitoes are likely to be out.
- When you're outside, wear socks, long sleeves and long pants as often as possible and apply an insect repellent with DEET (N, N-diethyl-meta-toluamide) in it.
- Never play near standing water like creeks or wading pools where mosquitoes hang out.
- You cannot get the virus through casual contact such as touching or kissing.
- Make sure you have good screens on your windows and doors to keep mosquitoes out.
- Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by emptying standing water from flower pots, buckets and barrels. Change the water in pet dishes and replace bird baths weekly. Keep wading pools empty.
- If you find a dead bird, don't handle the body with your bare hands. Contact your local health department to report and dispose of the bird.
- Check the health department database for current maps of infected areas and daily updates.






Where In The Galxay Is Cassini?

Zooming in with focus on familiar rings

Mer's severy ear 2-bit or mile journey through space. NASA's warney red

spacecraft Cessem is set to enter Setum's witht on June 30. The mis will focus on the makeup of the planet, its sings, magnetic field and noons, including its largest one. Then



Out so far in space that the sun is a tiny dot, the most sophisticated science spacecraft ever is nearing Saturn to begin a lengthy study of the ringed planet and its 31 moons.

Nearly seven years after it left Earth, Cassini, an internationally built craft named for a 17th-century astronomer, is on schedule to enter orbit June 30 after it dashes through a gap in Saturn's shimmering rings. Scientists hope its findings will reveal new secrets about the evolution of our solar system

Cassini had its first encounter with the Saturn system recently, hurtling within 1,240 miles of the outermost moon, Phoebe.

The tiny moon is just 137 miles across. Saturn, in contrast, is nearly 75,000 miles in diameter.

Scientists believe Phoebe originated in the outer reaches of the solar system and that it was later flung toward Saturn, which captured it into orbit.

"If it is, this will be our first encounter with something from that far out in the solar system," said Carolyn Porco, one of the team of scientists on the project.

Saturn is the sixth planet from the sun, between bigger Jupiter and smaller Uranus. It was previously visited in flybys by Pioneer 11; Voyager 1 & Voyager 2. But none of those visitors entered orbit around Saturn.

NASA built the plutonium-powered spacecraft; the European Space Agency contributed the Huygens (pronounced Hoy'-genz) probe. The spacecraft was launched in October 1997.

Cassini, weighing 5,384 pounds, carries 12 science instruments; Huygens has six.

Once at Saturn, Cassini should spend at least four years in orbit. Its two cameras could take as many as half a million pictures.

"Cassini-Huygens is the most sophisticated scientific spacecraft launched to the planets," said Orlando Figueroa, director of NASA's Solar System Exploration Division.

Mission members caution that getting into orbit won't be a cakewalk. Cassini must fire its engine on cue for 96 minutes to slow itself sufficiently and allow Saturn to pull it into orbit. If the maneuver fails, the spacecraft would sail past.

Cassini is set to release Huygens in December. A month later, scientists expect the probe to parachute through the murky atmosphere of Titan, Saturn's largest moon, and land on its surface.

Titan, larger than the planet Mercury, is the only moon in the solar system with an atmosphere and is believed to resemble what the Earth was like several billion years ago.

The mission is named after two 17th century scientists, the Italian-French astronomer Jean Dominique Cassini and the Dutch scientist Christiaan Huygens.
