

# Captain's Log, Kelly Communique Vol. 2, Issue 3

Greetings and Salutations!

It's been a very long time since we've released an issue of the Kelly Communique. In part, this is my fault because I haven't made it a priority. In part, it's because we haven't had the submissions we need to make this letter what it should be - about you. More specifically, about us as a club.

At the time of this writing, we have just come back from the Admiral's Banquet. For those of you that don't know, the Admiral's Banquet is one of two events held every year where we get to hang out with the other clubs in Starfleet Command's Seventh fleet. This year, the Banquet was something special, because the Fleet is celebrating its 25th year.

Think about that for a moment.

A lot of fan organizations don't last even five years and here we are, a group of fan clubs, celebrating our Silver Anniversary. That is something special. It's so special in fact that Larry Nemecek, author of many a Star Trek Concordance, a few episodes, and an actor in several fan films, has mentioned it on his worldwide Trekland podcast. He even filmed a special announcement for us that was played at the event. (A copy is available to view through the Captain as at this time we do not have permission to post it - yet.)

To celebrate this milestone, the Admiralty have created a Seventh Fleet Bingo which consists of twelve activities we can do throughout the year. When you do them, take a photo and show it to your Senior Officer or a member of the Command Staff. You can email the photo to: [bingo@seventhfleet.org](mailto:bingo@seventhfleet.org) or post it on your social media with the hashtags: #7thFleet25 and #WeDoNotStandAlone. There are two levels - regular BINGO (five activities) and Blackout (all twelve activities). So, what are these challenges? I'm glad you asked!

- **45th Rule of Acquisition**

The 45th Ferengi Rule of Acquisition is "Expand or Die". This challenge is to recruit a new member into the Seventh Fleet (any chapter, not just the Kelly - though we'd LOVE it if you recruit for the Kelly). Get a photo with the recruit receiving their orders, meeting the officers, etc.

- **Allamaraine**

Play any officially licensed Star Trek game. This can be a tabletop game, card game, even an electronic or online game such as Star Trek Online or Timelines. Admiral Stark has also said that Artemis will count IF it is done at an event such as SaltCon or FanX. Take a photo of you playing the game.

- **Best Served Cold**

Participate in a "Haagen-Dazs Challenge". This is a long-standing tradition in the Fleet, and while traditionally it's built around a trivia challenge, it can be anything. Take a photo

of the ice cream being passed from one person to another. (Also, it's "participate in", not "win" the challenge, so the same photo can be used for both people!)

- **Directive 927**  
"Always help those in need". This challenge is to participate in a Fleet- or Chapter-sanctioned charity event. Take a photo at the charity event.
- **Do You Trust Me?**  
In Star Trek IV: The Voyage Home, Gillian Taylor asked Captain Kirk this question just before she ordered her pizza. This challenge is to eat a slice of Gillian's favorite pizza: mushroom and pepperoni with extra onions. Take a photo of you eating the pizza.
- **Ex Astris Scientia**  
"Ex Astris Scientia" is the motto of Starfleet Academy. This challenge is to either take or teach a Seventh Fleet Academy course. You can come up with one of your own or choose one that's already been made. Either way, you'll need to contact Commodore Marla Trowbridge since she'll either give you the materials or approve it. Take a photo giving or taking the course.
- **GCEP**  
GCEP stands for the Galactic Cultural Exchange Project. For this challenge, attend the activity of another club. That club can be a different Seventh Fleet ship or something else entirely. Joint ship activities with another ship count. Fleet activities such as Fleet Day and conventions do not count. Take a photo at that activity.
- **Quark 2000**  
"Hear all, trust nothing". The Quark 2000 is supposed to be the best replicator ever. For this challenge make a dish from the Kelly Kookbook or any Star Trek recipe book. Take a photo.
- **The Scorch**  
In Strange New Worlds, the lower decks personnel participated in Enterprise Bingo (on which these challenges are based). One of those was to sign the oldest piece of non-replicated hull on the Enterprise. The Seventh Fleet version of that is to sign a special banner. Get a photo of you signing the banner. The banner will be at Fleet events like Fleet Day as well as public events, such as FanX.
- **The Sky's the Limit**  
The very last line in Star Trek: The Next Generation was when Picard joined the Senior Officers' poker game. This challenge is to play a poker game with members of your Star Trek family. Take a photo of the poker game.
- **Universal Translator**  
For this challenge, watch a Star Trek episode or movie in a foreign language (i.e. not English). Take a photo.
- **You Never Brought Me Tea**  
In the episode where Janeway visited Tuvok's memories of him bringing Captain Sulu tea, she said this line. For this challenge, create a new Merit Sheet and turn it in. It does NOT have to be a knowledge-based or trivia-based merit sheet (heck, we have several service and leadership merit sheets you can repeat!), but if you do make a knowledge-based one, there will need to be a minimum of 10 questions. Include an answer sheet. Take a photo of you holding your submission.

When the 25th Anniversary Bingo categories were defined at the Banquet, I had to laugh a little because as a Senior Staff we had already decided on this year's activities, and several of them dovetail nicely with these challenges. For example, our February activity is a game night and our April activity is based on the Kelly Kookbook! But with all of these, Admiral Stark has reminded us of one thing... we need to HAVE FUN.

That brings me to another announcement.

It has been a very, very long time since the USS Kelly has visited a convention en masse as a club. I put this forth as a goal late last year, and we decided that we want to do it this year. Therefore, we're going to try to keep the rest of the activities throughout the year rather low key. 

## 56-year Mission, Las Vegas (August 25-28, 2022)



This year the convention took place at Bally's rather than the Rio and was only four, instead of five days. Because the venue was smaller, fewer tickets were sold to the fans. No schedule was included in the booklet this year; it was only available online or as a separate daily printout.

Evelyn and Rich from the Pulsar were at the convention, so Mike and I met up with them several nights for dinner. I wore my Raffi gold uniform from PIC on Saturday, as did Evelyn, so we had our picture

taken together.

I spent most of my time, other than visiting the vendors, in the room with the main stage. Here's a rundown on the stars I saw:

### DAY 1:

Session 1: Denise Crosby (Tasha Yar from TNG).

Session 2: DS9 guest stars were next, including Phil Morris, the son of Greg Morris from Mission Impossible. He was in TOS ("Miri"), the third movie, DS9 ("Looking for Par'Mach"), and VOY (as a Jem'Hadar in "Rocks and Shoals").

Session 3: ENT panel—John Billingsley (Dr. Phlox), Dominic Keating (Malcom), Anthony Montgomery (Travis), and Conner Trineer (Trip).

Session 4: George Takei.

Session 5: The Okudas and Rod Roddenberry, promoting the Roddenberry Archive. They are currently working on a digital recreation of the original Starship Enterprise, which will allow fans to explore the bridge and other areas of the ship as well as use a turbolift and a transporter.

Session 6: Robert Picardo (the doctor on VOY).

Session 7: Dawn Lewis (the voice of Captain Carol Freeman) and Tawny Newsome (the voice of Beckett Mariner) from Lower Decks.



## DAY 2:

Session 1: Movie guest stars, including Robin Curtis (Saavik in Star Trek III and IV), Dina Meyer (Romulan Commander Donatra in Star Trek Nemesis), Deep Roy (Keensar in the movies Star Trek and Star Trek into Darkness), and Gwynyth Walsh (B'Etor, a Klingon, in TNG and DS9) were on this panel. Then a DS9 panel took the stage, which included Max Grodenchik (Rom), Terry Farrell (Jadzia Dax) Cirroc Lofton (Jake Sisko), and Andy Robinson (Garak).

Session 2: Rod Roddenberry and Trevor Roth. Rod talked a lot about his mother, Majel Barrett, whom he called an unsung hero for living two lives, that of Gene Roddenberry's wife and that of an actress in the Star Trek franchise.

Session 3: DISC panel-- Ian Alexander (Gray), Mary Chieffo (the Klingon L'Rell), Wilson Cruz (Dr. Hugh Culber), Tig Notaro (Engineer Jett Reno), and Sonequa Martin-Green (Michael Burnham). Sonequa noted that Nichele Nichols told her to "take care; it's yours now." Wilson commented on his role as Culber, who learned that he had a reason for dying and coming back, namely, that he is worthy of life and love.

Session 4: Guest stars of Trek--Rhonda Aldrich (Dixon Hill's secretary, Madeline, in TNG), Olivia D-Abo (Amanda Rogers, a female Q in TNG), Glenn Morshower (various roles in TNG, VOY, and ENT), and Tim Storms (a stunt double for Patrick Stewart in PIC).

Session 5: Walter Koenig (Chekov on TOS).

Session 6: DISC panel--Avaah Blackwell (Stuntwoman on DISC and SNW as well as an actress in DISC), Emily Coutts (Lt. Detmer), Noah Averbach-Katz (Ryn, an Andorian, and the husband of Mary Wiseman), Hannah Cheesman (Airiam in Season 2), and Alan van Sprang (Leland/Control in Season 2).

Session 7: SNW panel--Jess Bush (Christine Chapel), Celia Rose Gooding (Cadet Nyota Uhura), Bruce Horak (Hemmer, an Aenar), Anson Mount (Capt. Christopher Pike), Melissa Navia (Lt. Ortigas), Ethan Peck (Spock), and Rebecca Romijn (Commander Una Chin-Riley or Number One, an Illyrian).

## DAY 3:

Session 1: A tribute to Ricardo Montalban. Ricardo was the first Latino to be featured on the cover of Life magazine.

Session 2: PIC panel--Isa Briones (Soji, Dahj, Sutra, and Kore Soong), James Callis (Maurice Picard, father of Jean-Luc), Evan Evagora (Elnor), Jonathan Frakes (Riker and a director of some episodes), Michelle Hurd (Raffi), Peyton List (Narissa, a Romulan Tal Shiar colonel, a member of the Zhat Vash, and part of the Conclave

of Eight), Gates McFadden (Dr. Crusher who will be in Season 3), and Annie Wersching (the Borg Queen).

Session 3: DISC panel--Doug Jones (Saru), Patrick Kwok-Choon (Gen Rhys), and Anthony Rapp (Stamets) were in this group.

Session 4: Voyager Documentary Panel. Garrett Wang moderated. The filming is 98% finished and currently in the process of being edited. The documentary should be completed in about a year.

Session 5: Guest stars from TOS--Phil Adams (stunt double for Shatner), April Tatro (Isis in "Assignment: Earth"), Budd Albright (Barnhart in "The Man Trap" and Raburn in "What Are Little Girls Made Of?"), Mary Rice (young T'Pol in "Amok Time"), and William Knight (Moody in "The Naked Time"). Mary noted that she had the chicken pox and a fever when she filmed her part. April got \$68 and a box lunch for her role. Her costume, basically a piece of cloth, was glued on to her. Budd claimed to be the first red shirt to be killed. His neck was twisted and he was tossed down a well.

Session 6: Ron Pearlman, who played the Reman Viceroy in the movie *Star Trek Nemesis*.

Session 7: Kate Mulgrew, who spoke of things Janeway valued, like discipline and the need for fellowship, not trying to do things alone.

DAY 4:

Session 1: John Noble, the voice of the Diviner on Prodigy. He described his character as mysterious, multi-faceted, and focused on saving his race.

Session 2: DS9 panel--Nana Visitor (Kira Nerys), Jeffrey Combs (Brunt and Weyoun), Chase Masterson (Leeta), Armin Shimerman (Quark), Nicole DeBoer (Ezri Dax), Vaughn Armstrong (12 different characters in 4 Star Trek series), and Casey Biggs (Damar, a Cardassian), who talked about memorable and emotional moments for them in the series.

Session 3: Tribute to Star Trek actors/actresses who are no longer with us.

Session 4: VOY panel--Robert Beltran (Chakotay), Tim Russ (Tuvok), Jeri Ryan (Seven of Nine), and Garrett Wang (Harry Kim). Jeri talked about the differences between her character in VOY as compared to her character in PIC. She views VOY as her childhood years and PIC as her adult years.



On Saturday, Sept. 10, 2022, Star Trek Day was celebrated from 1-5 p.m. at the West Valley Public Library. This event was organized by the USS Delaware with a little help from several of the other ships. I put on my Raffi uniform and went early to help. I brought toilet paper and paper towel tubes for a crafts activity at the end of the day. People were already assembling Star Trek trivia cards, so I joined them.

A display case, filled with Star Trek memorabilia, greeted people as they arrived for the event. In the

auditorium, attendees were able to watch the episode “Amok Time” from TOS. Afterwards, Mary E. # Review of *Paramount Plus* shows, by Jill Bogler-Patterson

*Paramount Plus* has been putting a lot of new content out there.

First we had *Discovery*, which premiered in 2017. Set several years before *TOS*, this show centers around Michael Burnham, a human raised on Vulcan and her experiences during the Klingon War... among other things. My only complaint is an F-bomb dropped in Episode #5.

I enjoyed the first two seasons of *Picard* very much, except for a somewhat gratuitous F-bomb dropped in Season 1 Episode #2. I really love this show as it shows Picard's struggle with aging while dealing with galaxy-shaping events. Aging and Androids and Borg... oh, my!

Spanning events in both *Discovery* and *Picard* is *Short Treks*, a series of short stories between eight and eighteen minutes long. Some of these are serious, and some are just plain funny. I think my favorite is probably "The Trouble with Edward".

*Lower Decks* is an animated series definitely made for a more "mature" sense of humor, along the lines of South Park. Not my personal favorite, but it does have its funny parts.

*Prodigy* is the most recently released animated series. Created in cooperation with Nickelodeon, this animated series is geared more for children. However, like a lot of "kids" shows, I absolutely love this series. Centered around a group of young people exiled on a mining colony, this show explores the kids' journey as they find a strange ship named the **USS Protostar** with a training hologram named "Janeway".

## *Prodigy* Season 1 Episode Guide

- **Lost & Found** (*Two-part series premiere*) - A group of teens discover a derelict Starfleet Ship.
- **Starstruck** - The crew is tested when they are on a dangerous collision course.
- **Dreamcatcher** - The crew's first away mission is on a planet that manifests their deepest desires.
- **Terror Firma** - The crew must work together to escape a deadly planet.
- **Kobayashi** - Dal tests his leadership skills in the holodeck.
- **First Con-tact** - Dal's former mentor tries to persuade him to use their Federation cover for personal gain.
- **Time Amok** - The Protostar is fractured in time.
- **A Moral Star, Part 1** - The crew faces a real-life "no-win scenario".
- **A Moral Star, Part 2** - The crew has to improvise a new plan.

*Strange New Worlds* is the most recent live action series, and at the time of publication, Season 1 has been completed. It begins after the events in *Discovery* Season 2 and, I must say, is my favorite of the new Star Trek shows on Paramount Plus... but more on that another time.
